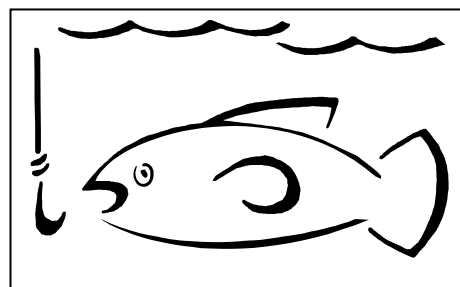

IMPORTANT: Buyers must bring own container filled with pond water.

(A plastic leaf can or garbage can lined with a garbage bag works well.)

Delivery date will be on April 5, 2011 at 9:30 a.m. at our office. Your order must be picked up at this time.

White Amur: Certified sterile, legal white amur that cannot reproduce. They eat aquatic vegetation and help keep ponds in balance without the use of herbicides. Overflow pipes need to be restricted with plastic or netting or bars with one inch spacing or less to prevent escape.

Redear Shell Crackers: help control mussels and snails.

Large Mouth Bass: Ohio's largemouth are known to get over 13 pounds, 5 pounds are common, but the average is from one to two pounds. Normal stocking rate is 100 per acre.

Yellow Perch: These hybrids can be raised on any farm pond. Hatchling love to feast on mosquito larvae. Normal stocking rate: 100 per acre.

Blue Gill: Feed almost exclusively on insects. Normal stocking rate 500 per acre.

Fathead Minnows: It's rapid rate of reproduction makes it an excellent choice for stocking where predatory fish are present. These minnows make great forage for large mouth bass.
