Planting instructions will be available the day of pick-up.

The Carroll Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) annual Tree Seedling & Plant Sale is underway and will continue through March.

The objective of the program is to provide low cost planting material to landowners to enhance the environment for future generations.

Species being offered include: red raspberry, black raspberry, blackberry, concord grape, red canadice grape, blueberry, arborvitae, American larch, white pine, black walnut, bur oak, butternut, flowering dogwood, Northern pecan, pussy willow, redbud, red oak, and wild black cherry.

Species should be selected based on soil type at the planting site. Conifers transplant easily and require minimum care after planting. Harwood varieties are more difficult to establish and require annual care after planting. Wildlife species such as Northern pecan and white flowering dogwood provide food and shelter for birds and mammals and make a good buffer between open and forested areas.

Landowners can get planting advice from their local SWCD office or a private forestry consultant.

Order early for the best selection. Payment must accompany order. Orders may be placed through the month of March, or until supplies are exhausted. Seedlings and plants can be picked up on April 15, 2011.
